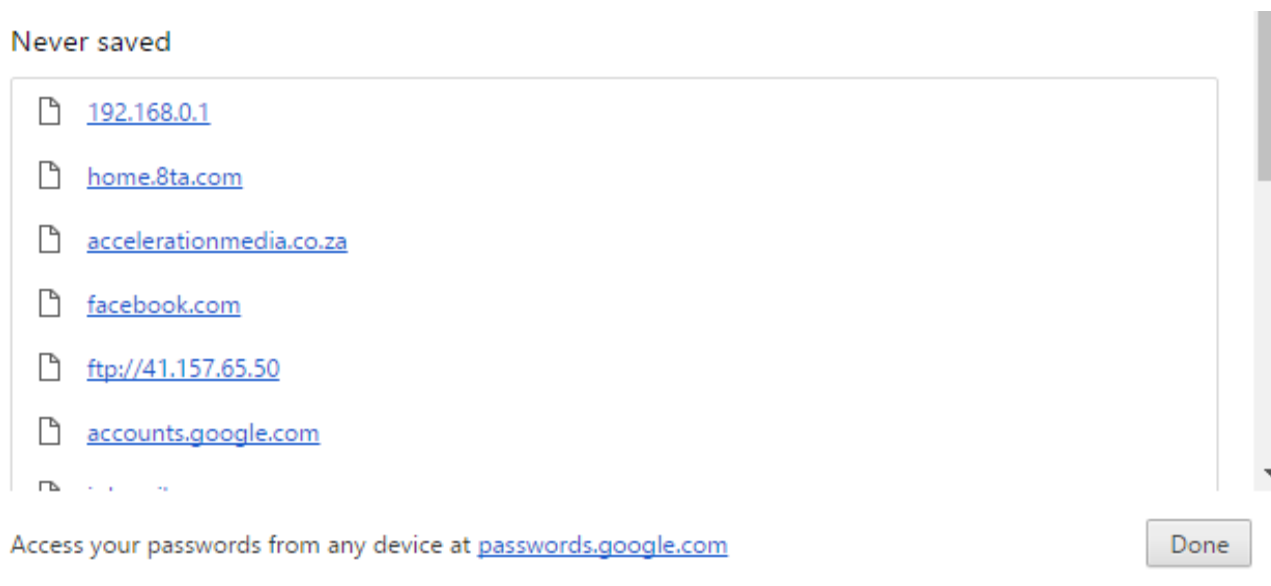
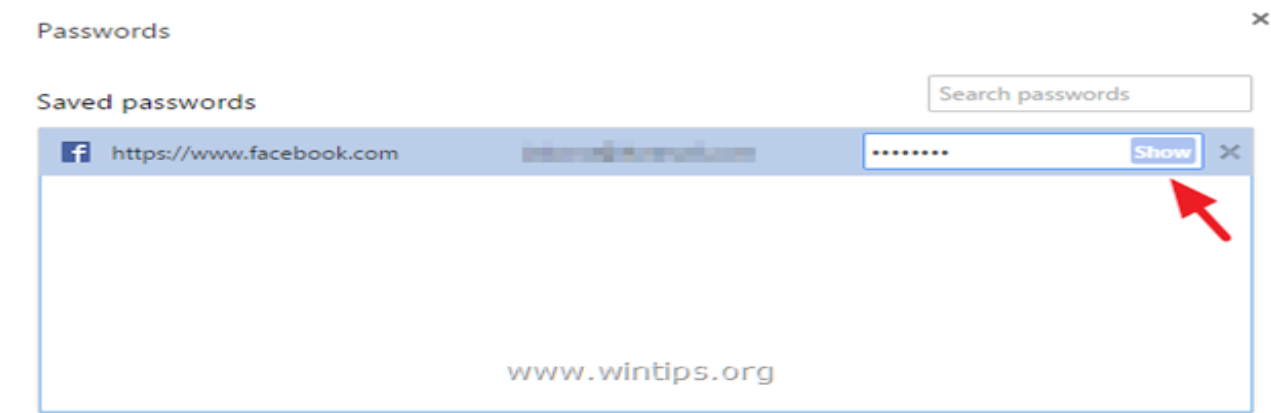


Besides the option for automatically signing in – someone you left with your preferred browser of use, might end up with your entire saved passwords list, and pry maybe?

## Browser password settings

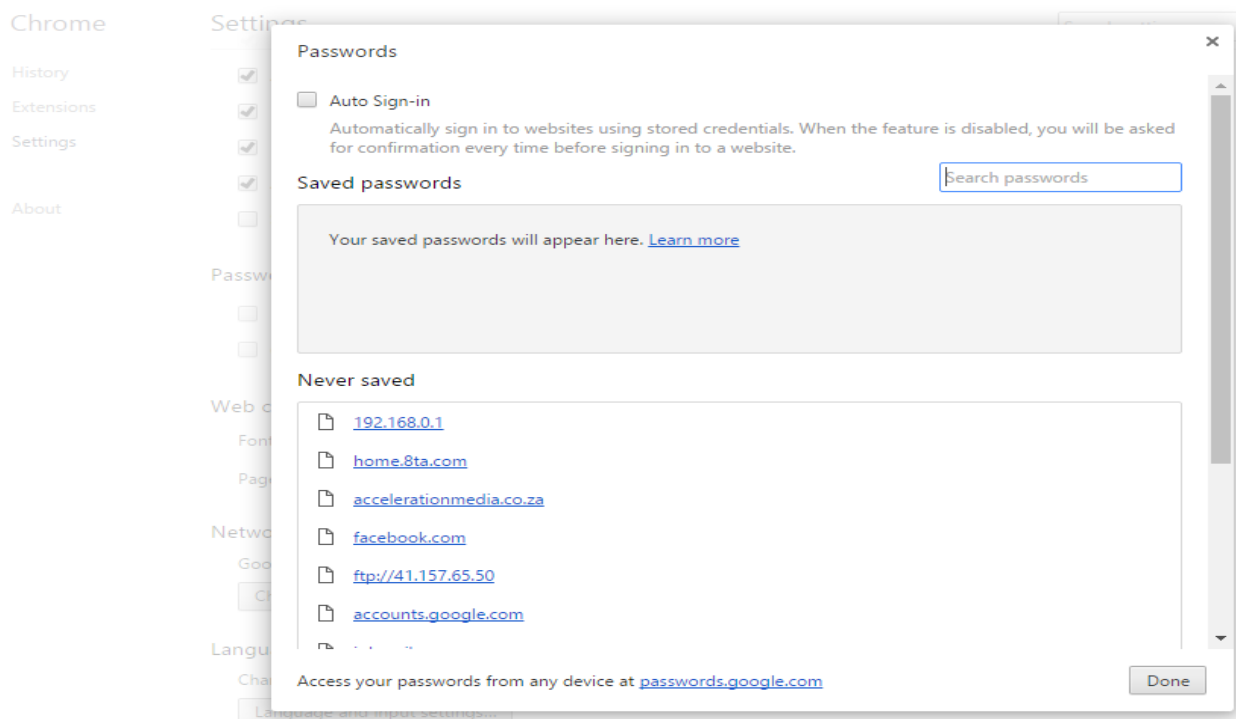
### Security:

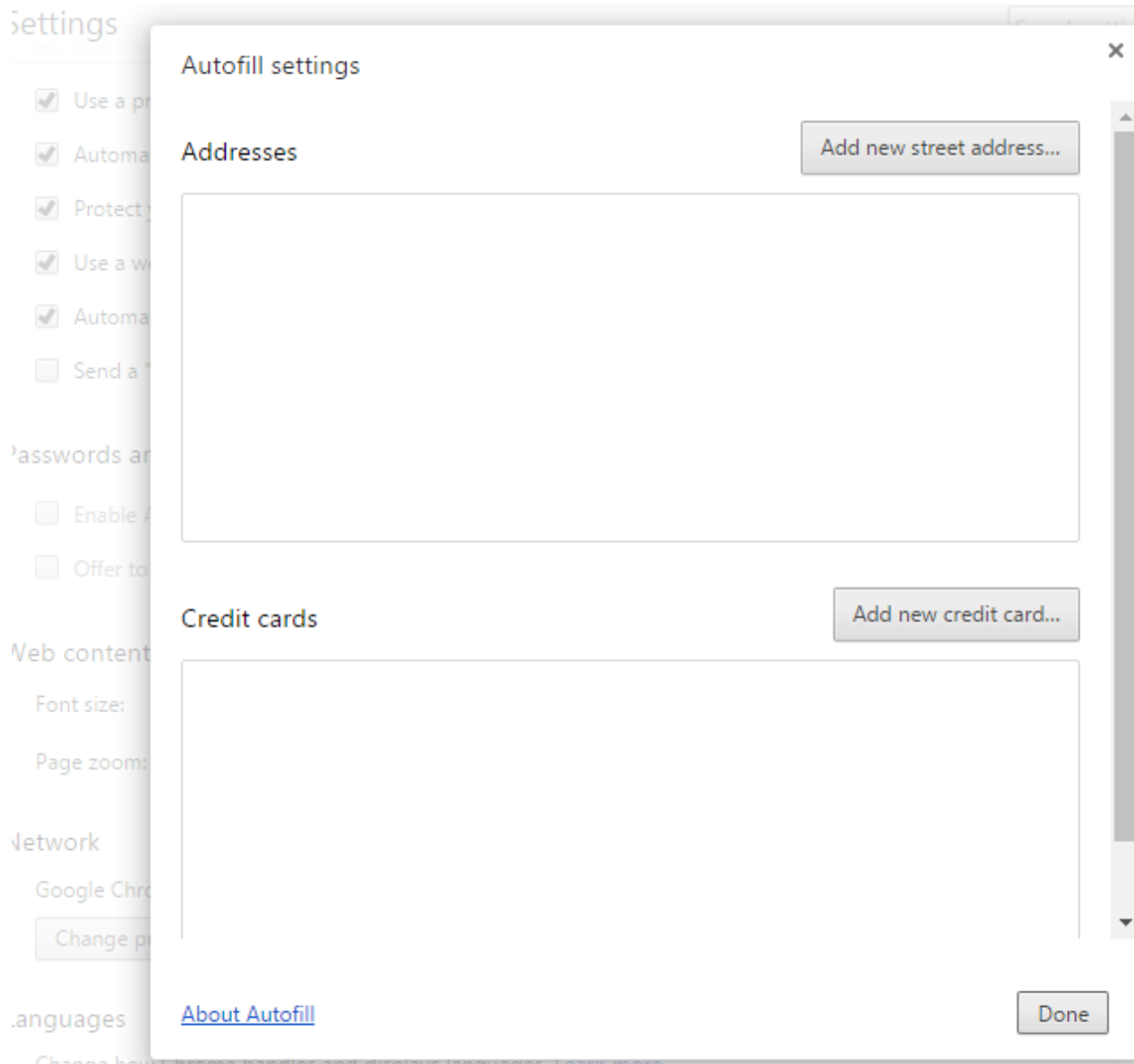
